New to Church? We do understand that coming to a church meeting can be an uncomfortable experience for many people. We don't want you to feel anxious. Our style is relaxed and friendly and nobody will be put on the spot or asked to do something unfamiliar. **You can simply be here and observe or participate to the degree you are comfortable.** You do not have to be a Christian; this is an opportunity, in a non-threatening environment to learn more about who Jesus is and why we want to follow him. If you don't feel like praying, singing, or even standing up you don't need to, no one will think less of you. We will try to explain some aspects of the meeting as we go but we realise that some of our practices may seem strange. If you have any questions about why we do any of the things we do please don't hesitate to ask anyone who's involved with the service. Our pastor would love to answer any questions you have about the service or the message.

Children's Ministry - Children are an important part of all we do.

In the second half of the meeting during the teaching time a program is available for children. *The children's group*, 3 to 9 years old, will meet in Classroom 3. *Pre-teens*, over 9 years old, will meet in the Crèche room opposite the hall entrance. This will be a time of interactive fun and teaching at their level so they too can understand the things concerning Jesus. You are **free as families** to send your children to that program **or** to keep them in the main meeting. We encourage children to be part of the main meeting as we believe God's heart for them is large and they too are able to learn the great things of the Christian faith. **There are worksheets available at the back for use during the message if you find this helpful.**

Crèche: AREA 1 – This is available for 0 to 2 year olds, during the sermon time, in the room on the right hand side of the building directly opposite the hall entrance. The person running the crèche will be waiting and available at the back of the hall. If they are not there then they will already be serving in the crèche room. AREA 2 - The back part of the meeting room also has a child-friendly area where parents can feel a little more relaxed with their small children but still join in the worship.

Thanks again for joining with us this morning. We hope you find the time to be both encouraging and thought provoking. Please join us after the service for coffee, tea and snacks.

Time of Confession and Repentance Romans 3:19-25

¹⁹ Now we know that whatever the law says it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be stopped, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. ²⁰ For by works of the law no human being will be justified in his sight, since through the law comes knowledge of sin.

Corporate assurance of Grace The Heidelberg Catechism³

Question 1 What is your only comfort in life and death?

Answer That I am not my own, but belong—body and soul, in life and in death—to my faithful Saviour, Jesus Christ.

He has fully paid for all my sins with his precious blood, and has set me free from the tyranny of the devil. He also watches over me in such a way that not a hair can fall from my head without the will of my Father in heaven; in fact, all things must work together for my salvation.

Because I belong to him, Christ, by his Holy Spirit, assures me of eternal life and makes me wholeheartedly willing and ready from now on to live for him.

Message Sermon Series - Psalms for everyday life "Praise, Lament and Thanksgiving"

#2 "Lament" - Psalm 69 - "Disorientation"

INTRODUCTION

 The three great genres or types of Psalms: Praise; Lament and Thanksgiving

Songs of Lament/Disorientation; e.g., 3-7; 9-10; 22; 32; 42-44; 51; 60; 88; 94; 102; 137. Songs of Lament are for times when life is not well ordered or orientated. Times of , for example, confusion, uncertainty or fear, anger, despair. These are the times we cry out to God (Ps 13:1,2; 22:1; 88:18) These psalms are for the times some have described as "the dark night of the soul", for times when weeping goes on (Ps 6:6; 30:5). These psalms give us permission and show us how to let the feelings flow. Christ, the real man, no doubt prayed laments during his life on earth (Heb 5:7) and particularly on the cross (Matt 27:46 – Ps 22:1).

I. LAMENT – FOR TIMES OF DISORIENTATION Psalm 69

Laments are usually composed of 7 characteristics: invocation; plea for help; complaints; confession; imprecation; expression of confidence and often end in a song of praise.

These characteristics may overlap and meld together - Ps 69 has at least 6 of these:

Verse 1 Invocation/Plea

Verses 1-4 Complaint

Verses 5-6 Confession

Verses 7-12 Complaint

Verses 13-18 A further Plea for help

Verses 19-21 Complaint

Verses 22-28 Imprecation (Cursing enemies)

Verse 29 Transition

Verses 30-36 A hymn of Praise

II. WHAT CAN WE LEARN FROM THIS PSALM?

- It is not historically specific, therefore it can be used by any generation to draw near to God.
- We can also learn that we can bring our concerns, our distresses, our fears, our emotions to God with an open and honest heart
- Consider how it is used in the NT

Questions for meditation

- Ps 69 is an honest and powerful example of a personal lament.
 David is suffering and he writes. Can you identify with some of the descriptions of the troubles, the disorientation, David encounters? Discuss the purpose of the Laments and the validity of expressing them today.
- 2. What do we do with the cursing of enemies in these Psalms?
- 3. How can Ps 69 be used to inform the way we respond to Jesus?

It is an opportunity to feed on Him by faith and to be strengthened as His followers. Therefore, it is appropriate that only those who are truly Christians should participate. That is, those who profess faith in Christ as Saviour and Lord, who are baptised into His church and who seek to live obedient lives. If this does not describe you, we encourage you not to take the bread or wine but to use the opportunity to consider the things you have heard in today's service and to consider the claims of Christ and what they mean for you.
