Call to Worship 1 Peter 3:3-9¹

³ Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to his great mercy, he has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, ⁴ to an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you, ⁵ who by God's power are being guarded through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time. ⁶ In this you rejoice, though now for a little while, if necessary, you have been grieved by various trials, ⁷ so that the tested genuineness of your faith—more precious than gold that perishes though it is tested by fire—may be found to result in praise and glory and honour at the revelation of Jesus Christ. ⁸ Though you have not seen him, you love him. Though you do not now see him, you believe in him and rejoice with joy that is inexpressible and filled with glory, ⁹ obtaining the outcome of your faith, the salvation of your souls.

The Lord's Supper Who is this for? Jesus himself has appointed this means of remembering His death on the cross and the benefits that come to us. ⁵ The term "catholic" here means "worldwide" and "universal" in regards to the church and is not referring to any particular denomination.

⁶ Potentate means someone with potent, sovereign or supreme power. Here it is coupled with "time" so that this line asures us that the Lord, who is also good, absolutely rules all time and history, how wonderful.

⁷ "Ineffable" means "too great, powerful, beautiful, etc., to be expressed or described in words". A very fitting way to refer to the Lord. Here it is coupled with the word "sublime", which means, "of very great excellence or beauty, exalted, elevated, noble, lofty, awe-inspiring, awesome, majestic..." It is a word we might use to describe a magnificent scene or a great piece of music. Again, wonderfully appropriate in relation to the one true and living God. "ineffably sublime", then, could be expressed in simple language by saying, "He is so awesome we cannot find enough words to describe Him".

Encouragement Group Discussion Questions

Scripture Reading 1 Corinthians 15:3-21

- 1. Read Luke 24:1-12. Discuss the details of the resurrection. What actually took place? What was the initial response of the disciples? Why is that important? Compare with Acts 2:23,24. What made the difference?
- In the message, 9 benefits of the Resurrection were mentioned. 2. Which one stood out for you personally and why? Take time to share.
- Is there another benefit that is important to you that was not 3. covered?
- What do you think of this statement: "The resurrection also puts the burden of proof on its nonbelievers" (see Some Thoughts below)? What are the evidences for the Resurrection that you find helpful? How might they help skeptical friends?
- How does the resurrection make this life worth living? And what 5. does that living look like? How does the resurrection speak to the current situation we are facing in New Zealand or that is being faced in other countries of the world?

⁸ Benediction: literally, "good word" or "speak well"; a verbal blessing pronounced in God's name by the Pastor, at the conclusion of the service, sending us forth from this special time as we continue our lives seeking to know and follow Jesus.

Some thoughts

"Most people think that, when it comes to Jesus's resurrection, the burden of proof is on believers to give evidence that it happened. This is not completely the case. The resurrection also puts the burden of proof on its nonbelievers. It is not enough to simply believe Jesus did not rise from the dead. You must then come up with a historically feasible alternate explanation for the birth of the church."

Timothy Keller The Reason for God, p202

"I know the resurrection is a fact, and Watergate proved it to me. How? Because 12 men testified they had seen Jesus raised from the dead, then they proclaimed that truth for 40 years, never once denying it. Every one was beaten, tortured, stoned and put in prison. They would not have endured that if it weren't true. Watergate embroiled 12 of the most powerful men in the world-and they couldn't keep a lie for three weeks. You're telling me 12 apostles could keep a lie for 40 years? Absolutely impossible."

"The Bible says he was raised not just after the blood-shedding, but by it. This means that what the death of Christ accomplished was so full and so perfect that the resurrection was the reward and vindication of Christ's achievement in death."

Silent Prayers for use during the Lord's Supper

Prayer of uncertainty God, I don't even know if you exist or if I'm just talking to myself. If you are real, please help me to come to know you. Open my heart and my mind to consider the truth claims of Jesus who is called the Christ. Help me to see both my need for you and how Jesus is the provision for that need. Give me the answers I need and dissolve any dishonest objections that I hold to your existence Amen.

Prayer for those searching for truth Lord Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth and the life. If what you claim is true, please guide me, teach me, and open to me the reality of who you are. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and that leads to the life that you promise. Amen.

Prayer of belief Lord Jesus, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever before believed, but, through you, I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared to hope. I thank you for paying my debt, bearing my punishment on the cross and offering forgiveness and new life. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive you as my Saviour. Amen.

Prayer of commitment Lord Jesus, you have called us to follow you in baptism and in a life of committed discipleship in your church. Grant that I may take the necessary steps to be one with your people, and live in the fullness of your Spirit. Amen.

Prayer for those struggling with sin Lord Jesus, grant that I may see in you the fulfilment of all my needs, and may turn from every false satisfaction to feed on you, the true and living bread. Enable me to lay aside the sin that clings so closely, and run with perseverance the race set before me, looking only to you, the author and finisher of my faith. Amen.

Prayer for the believer Father, I come now to your table, to partake of Christ's body and blood in holy communion. I ask that you would search my heart and show me my failings and sins so that I may repent and turn to embrace your promises anew. Although I am unworthy, you have made me worthy. Though I am a sinner, you have taken away my sins by your very own body and blood. May you be glorified in our partaking of your sacrament. Amen.
