He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in everything he might be pre-eminent. ¹⁹ For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, ²⁰ and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of his cross.

- 1. Discuss all the ways that the Sovereign reign, or Lordship, of Jesus Christ is expressed here. How do they put the world, our lives, and even current events in perspective?
- 2. Think about the relationship between these two things: that He is both supremely sovereign and supremely good; or, that the Lord of all gave Himself to die on a cross to bring us into the blessing of His Kingdom and Lordship. How does that speak to our hearts tendencies to rebel against His Lordship and to not want to trust and obey.
- 3. Why is worship the right and proper response to the Lordship expressed here? What does worship look like?
- 4. Why is obedience the right and proper response to the Lordship expressed here? What does obedience look like?
- 5. Why is trust the right and proper response to the Lordship expressed here? What does trust look like?
