³ Ebenezer is a name meaning "stone of help" and refers to a stone that was set up by the Israelites to remember a victory over the Philistines by God's help, when previously they had suffered defeat, see 1 Samuel 7:12. The memorial stone represented God's merciful help to His people; it also therefore represents a fresh beginning, a reversal of course for God's people. It also says something important about God's commitment to His redeemed people: His mercies are everlasting; his covenant is forever. As we sing these words it says the same for us. We remember that God has shown us His mercies and faithfulness and so we are strengthened and encouraged to continue to walk by faith in Him and His grace as we go into the unknown future.

A Corporate Profession of Faith 1 Peter 1:3-9

Leader Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ!

- People According to his great mercy, he has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead,
- **Leader** to an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you,
- People who by God's power are being guarded through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time.
- Leader In this you rejoice, though now for a little while, if necessary, you have been grieved by various trials, so that the tested genuineness of your faith
- People more precious than gold that perishes though it is tested by fire—may be found to result in praise and glory and honour at the revelation of Jesus Christ.
- ALL Though <u>we</u> have not seen him, <u>we</u> love him. Though <u>we</u> do not now see him, <u>we</u> believe in him and rejoice with joy that is inexpressible and filled with glory, obtaining the outcome of <u>our</u> faith, the salvation of <u>our</u> souls.


The Gospel Transformation Bible

Here is a list of the staples most needed:

- Breakfast cereals, porridge.
- Tins- baked beans, vegetables, tomatoes, fruit.
- Meal in a can-soups, Big Eat.
- Pasta Rice.
- Noodles dried & instant
- Sauces tin/jar, pasta sauces, gravy,/sauces sachets.
- Biscuits, crackers, muesli bars.
- UHT milk, milk powder.
- Tea bags
- Instant coffee.
- Toothpaste.
- Toilet rolls.
- Soup.
