Welcome to Shore Presbyterian Church

New to Church? We do understand that coming to a church meeting can be an uncomfortable experience for many people. We don't want you to feel anxious. Our style is relaxed and friendly and nobody will be put on the spot or asked to do something unfamiliar. *You can simply be here and observe or participate to the degree you are comfortable.* You do not have to be a Christian; this is an opportunity, in a non-threatening environment to learn more about who Jesus is and why we want to follow him. If you don't feel like praying, singing, or even standing up you don't need to, no one will think less of you. We will try to explain some aspects of the meeting as we go but we realise that some of our practices may seem strange. If you have any questions about why we do any of the things we do please don't hesitate to ask anyone who's involved with the service. Our pastor would love to answer any questions you have about the service or the message.

Children's Ministry - Children are an important part of all we do.

In the second half of the meeting during the teaching time a program is available for children. *The children's group*, 3 to 9 years old, will meet in Classroom 3. *Pre-teens*, over 9 years old, will meet in the Crèche room opposite the hall entrance. This will be a time of interactive fun and teaching at their level so they too can understand the things concerning Jesus. You are **free as families** to send your children to that program **or** to keep them in the main meeting. We encourage children to be part of the main meeting as we believe God's heart for them is large and they too are able to learn the great things of the Christian faith. **There are worksheets available at the back for use during the message if you find this helpful.**

Crèche: AREA 1 – This is available for **0 to 2 year olds**, during the sermon time, in the room on the right hand side of the building directly opposite the hall entrance. The person running the crèche will be waiting and available at the back of the hall. If they are not there then they will already be serving in the crèche room. **AREA 2** - The back part of the meeting room also has a child-friendly area where parents can feel a little more relaxed with their small children but still join in the worship.

Thanks again for joining with us this morning. We hope you find the time to be both encouraging and thought provoking. Please join us after the service for coffee, tea and snacks.

³ Ebenezer is a name meaning "stone of help" and refers to a stone that was set up by the Israelites to remember a victory over the Philistines by God's help, when previously they had suffered defeat, see 1 Samuel 7:12. The memorial stone represented God's merciful help to His people; it also therefore represents a fresh beginning, a reversal of course for God's people. It also says something important about God's commitment to His redeemed people: His mercies are everlasting; his covenant is forever. As we sing these words it says the same for us. We remember that God has shown us His mercies and faithfulness and so we are strengthened and encouraged to continue to walk by faith in Him and His grace as we go into the unknown future.

¹Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. ² Through him we have also obtained access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and we rejoice in hope of the glory of God. ³ More than that, we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, ⁴ and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, 5 and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us. **Amen.**

Encouragement Group Discussion Questions

Scripture Readings Nehemiah 6; Isaiah 8:112-14a; 1 Peter 3:14-15a; 1 John 4:17-18

- 1. Consider the Devil's tactic of fear in this chapter. What are the enemies trying to make Nehemiah and the people afraid of? How effective is fear? What are the things we can be afraid of and how can they disable us as Christians?
- 2. As Satan seeks to disable Nehemiah for ultimate impact, what can be the wider impacts from Satan disabling you in Christian life and service?
- 3. What is the healthy fear that Nehemiah has which becomes an effective antidote for disabling fear? Think of the example of other characters in the Bible and how they were used of God.
- 4. Discuss "One of the key strategies of faith is to tackle fear not by belittling the fear or wishing it away but by taking our eyes off that which makes us afraid and looking to God" (*Gospel Transformation Bible*). Think about the occasion when Peter walked with Christ on the water. In your own life how have you seen your eyes fixed on the object of fear rather than on God?
- 5. What is the fear of God? What does it look like and how does it work itself out in our lives? Think about 1 John 4:17,18 and what a right and healthy fear is?
- 6. Think about verse 9. What is Nehemiah asking? How does this help us in understanding that the fear of God is not of a distant God but a God of grace who is near to help us be and do what he calls us to be and do?
- 7. What are some ways that you can grow in a healthy and fruitful fear of God?
