New to Church? We do understand that coming to a church meeting can be an uncomfortable experience for many people. We don't want you to feel anxious. Our style is relaxed and friendly and nobody will be put on the spot or asked to do something unfamiliar. **You can simply be here and observe or participate to the degree you are comfortable.** You do not have to be a Christian; this is an opportunity, in a non-threatening environment to learn more about who Jesus is and why we want to follow him. If you don't feel like praying, singing, or even standing up you don't need to, no one will think less of you. We will try to explain some aspects of the meeting as we go but we realise that some of our practices may seem strange. If you have any questions about why we do any of the things we do please don't hesitate to ask anyone who's involved with the service. Our pastor would love to answer any questions you have about the service or the message.

Children's Ministry - Children are an important part of all we do.

In the second half of the meeting during the teaching time a program is available for children. *The children's group*, 3 to 9 years old, will meet in Classroom 3. *Pre-teens*, over 9 years old, will meet in the Crèche room opposite the hall entrance. This will be a time of interactive fun and teaching at their level so they too can understand the things concerning Jesus. You are **free as families** to send your children to that program **or** to keep them in the main meeting. We encourage children to be part of the main meeting as we believe God's heart for them is large and they too are able to learn the great things of the Christian faith. **There are worksheets available at the back for use during the message if you find this helpful.**

Crèche: AREA 1 – This is available for 0 to 2 year olds, during the sermon time, in the room on the right hand side of the building directly opposite the hall entrance. The person running the crèche will be waiting and available at the back of the hall. If they are not there then they will already be serving in the crèche room. AREA 2 - The back part of the meeting room also has a child-friendly area where parents can feel a little more relaxed with their small children but still join in the worship.

Thanks again for joining with us this morning. We hope you find the time to be both encouraging and thought provoking. Please join us after the service for coffee, tea and snacks.

Message Isaiah 1:1 – 2:5 "God's Overture to His People"

Message outline for your notes, thoughts, questions

Introduction

Isaiah 1:1 - 2:5 functions as an introduction to the themes of the book as a whole.

The contrast between the two ways of life: man-centredness versus God-centredness.

Isaiah 1:1 - 2:5 is God's overture to his people - a call to return to Him. However, Isaiah makes it clear that God's final goal and purpose will be achieved - a new heavens and new earth - a new Jerusalem in which righteousness and peace dwell (Isaiah 65-66); all on the basis of the person and the completed work of the true Servant and King.

The New Testament will see these ideas fulfilled in the Person and Work of Jesus Christ as it references the book of Isaiah more than forty times.

Isaiah 1:1 - Describes the entire book in a single vision - It is Isaiah's vision and the period of his ministry, approximately 40 years is from the year Uzziah died in 740 B.C. (See Isaiah 6:1) until after 701 B.C., the time of Hezekiah and siege of Jerusalem by the Assyrian Sennacherib.

Isaiah 1:2-9 - The sinful nation - the Indictment of the Lord.

'Hear' verse 2 a call to heavens and the earth - why? This has universal significance - we are included.

Isaiah 1:10-17 - Corrupt worship - 'Hear' verse 10 (see verse 2) - starts a new unit.

Isaiah 1:18-20 - *Ultimatum* - "Come now let us reason together" Grace is hard to understand when our view of God is too small.

Isaiah 1:21-31 - Lament, Purification and redemption

Isaiah laments and writes of the utter moral collapse of Jerusalem. Will Judah acknowledge who God is and respond to him appropriately?

But there's more! - Isaiah's vision Continues:

Isaiah 2:1-5 - The Mountain of the Lord.

If the hopeless situation of chapter 1 is to be reversed, it can only be by divine intervention in redemptive grace.

Consider the challenge of verse 5

The Lord's Supper Who is this for? Jesus himself has appointed this means of remembering His death on the cross and the benefits that come to us. It is an opportunity to feed on Him by faith and to be strengthened as His followers. Therefore, it is appropriate that only those who are truly Christians should participate. That is, those who profess faith in Christ as Saviour and Lord, who are baptised into His church and who seek to live obedient lives. If this does not describe you, we encourage you not to take the bread or wine but to use the opportunity to consider the things you have heard in today's service and to consider the claims of Christ and what they mean for you. You may find some help in one of the prayers printed on page 17. If you have questions about these things, please contact Pastor Peter.

Encouragement Group Discussion Questions

Scripture Reading Isaiah 1:1 – 2:5

- 1. From Isaiah 1:1-2:5 as a whole, identify and discuss the key characteristics of man-centredness and God-centredness. How are we included in this? (Cf. Isaiah 1:2)
- 2. During the reign of Uzziah, Judah experienced peace and prosperity marked by spiritual decline, while the growing threat of Assyrian expansion in the north provided the backdrop to Isaiah's predictions. Predictions which concerned the immediate future for Judah, but is in the past for us. During Isaiah's ministry the Assyrian threat materialised, then receded, and was replaced by the growth of Babylonian power to the east.

What can we learn from the historical context of Isaiah and what principles should we apply today?

- 3. Consider the challenge of Isaiah 2:5 and consider how it relates to passages such as Isaiah 42:6; John 8:12 and 1 John 1:5-2:1
- 4. What 'building blocks' can you take-away from this passage? Anything that could answer the questions:
 - i. Why do I need to know this?
 - ii. What do I need to know?
 - iii. How does this work?
 - iv. What can this become?
