The Lord's Supper Who is this for? Jesus himself has appointed this means of remembering His death on the cross and the benefits that come to us. It is an opportunity to feed on Him by faith and to be strengthened as His followers. Therefore, it is appropriate that only those who are truly Christians should participate. That is, those who profess faith in Christ as Saviour and Lord, who are baptised into His church and who seek to live obedient lives. If this does not describe you, we encourage you not to take the bread or wine but to use the opportunity to consider the things you have heard in today's service and to consider the claims of Christ and what they mean for you. Corporate prayer of assurance and thanksgiving

Psalm 103:1-5, 8-19

- **Leader** Bless the Lord, O my soul, and all that is within me, bless his holy name!
- People Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits, who forgives all your iniquity, who heals all your diseases,
- **Leader** who redeems your life from the pit, who crowns you with steadfast love and mercy,

Silent Prayers for use during the Lord's Supper

Prayer of uncertainty God, I don't even know if you exist or if I'm just talking to myself. If you are real, please help me to come to know you. Open my heart and my mind to consider the truth claims of Jesus who is called the Christ. Help me to see both my need for you and how Jesus is the provision for that need. Give me the answers I need and dissolve any dishonest objections that I hold to your existence Amen.

Prayer for those searching for truth Lord Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth and the life. If what you claim is true, please guide me, teach me, and open to me the reality of who you are. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and that leads to the life that you promise. Amen.

Prayer of belief Lord Jesus, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever before believed, but, through you, I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared to hope. I thank you for paying my debt, bearing my punishment on the cross and offering forgiveness and new life. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive you as my Saviour. Amen.

Prayer of commitment Lord Jesus, you have called us to follow you in baptism and in a life of committed discipleship in your church. Grant that I may take the necessary steps to be one with your people, and live in the fullness of your Spirit. Amen.

Prayer for those struggling with sin Lord Jesus, grant that I may see in you the fulfilment of all my needs, and may turn from every false satisfaction to feed on you, the true and living bread. Enable me to lay aside the sin that clings so closely, and run with perseverance the race set before me, looking only to you, the author and finisher of my faith. Amen.

Prayer for the believer Father, I come now to your table, to partake of Christ's body and blood in holy communion. Encouragement Group Discussion Questions

Scripture Reading 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18

- 1. Why is it important that Paul recognizes the reality of grief in this life? How is the sense of grief a mark of life in this world? What difference is the Christian hope meant to make? Is that actually your experience? Why or why not?
- 2. There are many confusing views about the return of Christ in the Church. What particularly confuses you?
- 3. What does this passage say about "rapture" (see "caught up" in verse 17)? How is this meant to encourage believers rather than worry or confuse them?
- 4. Sometimes we struggle with certainty regarding our own future. Think about words like, "those who have fallen asleep" (verse 14), "the dead in Christ" (verse 16), "a cry of command" (verse 16) and "since we believe that Jesus died and rose again" (verse 14) how do these all give us a personal assurance?
- 5. How important is bodily resurrection and has it sometimes been underplayed in the Church?
- 6. Does it make a difference to how we live now? Should it make a difference to our view of ourselves, our bodies, the earth and others? How?
