Encouragement Group Discussion Questions

Scripture Reading Philippians 1:12-26

- 1. Think about the theme of joy in Philippians. Are you surprised by Paul's approach to his sufferings? Why? Is it your own view? How might this be a relevant issue right now?
- 2. What made the seismic shift in Paul's thinking about everything including suffering? Examine how he could see good things resulting from difficult circumstances.
- 3. How would you sum up Paul's reason for living and for dying? And what made him that way?
- 4. Think about Paul's view of the value of death. Then consider the irony of actually living as a sacrifice. How does that challenge us?
- 5. How can we grow and help each other, *even in difficult times* to:
 - 1. To know and love Jesus more,
 - 2. To seek His glory,
 - 3. To bless others in Christ?
